Conflict Minerals Policy Statement

We are in receipt of your request regarding Conflict Minerals and Section 1502 of the Dodd Frank Act. Intro Corporation is aware of the conflict minerals reporting requirements within the Act. Intro Corporation recognizes our responsibility not to support or contribute to the violence and human rights violations associated with the mining in Central Africa of minerals that are essential to the electronics industry.

Intro Corporation is not a manufacturer of electronic parts and therefore is not in a position to provide accurate information relating to the use of Conflict Minerals in the products it distributes. The manufacturers of electronic components are the only source of accurate information regarding Conflict Minerals used in their products. It is our understanding that many manufacturers as of this date have not yet verified that their supply chains are compliant with the Conflict Minerals Section of the Dodd Frank Act. As a result very few manufacturers are providing the Conflict Minerals Reporting document.

Intro Corporation is fully aware of the importance of the Conflict Minerals issue and will work with all of our customers to supply the information required.
